Cultural Focus 2008-09: Art in the Heart of the Earth

Sayaka Ganz was born in Yokohama, Japan and grew up living in Japan, Brazil, and Hong Kong. She received her Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in Printmaking from Indiana University in Bloomington. Sayaka was first introduced to welding during her junior year at Indiana University. She fell in love with the process and continued to work with it independently. She received Master of Fine Arts degree in sculpture from Bowling Green State University in Bowling Green, Ohio. Currently she teaches design and drawing courses at Indiana University – Purdue University Fort Wayne. - Using post-consumer plastic objects as her main materials, Sayaka's recent sculptures depict animals in motion with rich colors and energy. Her recent exhibitions include: "Finding Freedom"- MFA thesis exhibition at the Dorothy Uber Bryan Gallery at Bowling Green State University, "Thinking in 3D" – an educational group exhibition at the Fort Wayne Museum of Art, "Regional Winners"- Three award winners' exhibition at Artlink Contemporary Art Gallery, and "Two Visions: Ink and Steel" – Solo exhibition of prints and sculptures at Robert E. Wilson Gallery, Huntington College. She will have a solo exhibition at Fort Wayne Botanical Conservatory Jan 10–Feb 27, 2009.

OD TAPO IMI plays traditional island music and today's current & world hits - each song does not sound like the others. They create a unique and appealing visual experience with island scenery, special effects, props & clean equipment. No electrical device, cord or speaker is seen from our stage. OD TAPO IMI is "Summertime, Anytime!" By the way, the band's name is actually an acronym... OD TAPO IMI = "Oil Drums That Are Pounded Out Into Musical Instruments." Steel drums, guitars, assorted percussion, drum set, horns and vocals with four part harmonies power this exultant, wild musical show/review. Complex layering of sonorous ringing steel drums and boiling percussion grabs you immediately and doesn't let go. You'll hear "Conga," "Day-O," "Jump in the Line," "The Lion Sleeps Tonight," and even "Twist & Shout" with energy, chops & humor.

Lisa Vetter –NW Visiting Artist only—Our work is inspired by the natural world and is in response to our throw away society. Americans dispose of more usable items than some countries produce. The found objects we collect tell the stories of bygone travels, miscalculated gifts, and can be a historical reminder of previous generations. By creatively "upcycling" these objects with other media we not only offer a new story to an old item, we also challenge the viewer to observe these everyday items in a completely different way. * We design and create each piece at "the Art Farm", our restored 1860 farm studio and home. Our works range in scale from room lighting to wearable pieces and are primarily functional. A wide variety of found objects are assembled with textiles and mixed metals. The metals are hand-formed, cut, cold-connected, textured, forged, engraved, riveted, pierced, soldered, and/or oxidized. Textiles are both hand and machine stitched as well as hand felted. Many pieces are embellished with glass beads or other small found objects.

Importance of the Arts in our Community

The ARTS are essential in making a community a vital, growing place of destination. Think of our community without FAME, the Philharmonic, Civic Theater, the Ballet, Fort Wayne Museum of Art, Dance Collective, Art Link and the many other non-profit arts groups. What would it look and feel like to live in a place void of culture and arts.

The arts are critical in the success of drawing businesses and people to live in Fort Wayne. The Arts bring money into our community. The Arts make us human and add to our quality of life.

The Arts are in Peril

With all this said, there is a very disturbing situation in our country and especially in our community. The Arts again are the first to be diminished in the curriculum. Southwest Allen County Schools, a community leader in providing 40 minutes of music, art and PE twice a week for all children from 1 through 5, with kindergarten getting one 40 minute period, is now in a situation of budget cuts, where they are contemplating cutting the time of the arts to 30 minutes twice a week, thus all full time teachers will be traveling to different schools and all part time specialists will lose their jobs. There will be a referendum for SACS, which will bring in some revenue essential to running the corporation, but not enough to save many arts positions. In 1987, Mike Schmid and I founded FAME because of a similar situation of budget reductions always cutting the arts. We wanted to bring the value of the art to the public through exhibiting the arts of young children and encouraging creativity, which now, according to many of our arts teachers, is waning in our children. The arts have taken a backseat in the eyes of school systems when the testing covers math, science and language arts and puts the arts as a "non-academic subject" thus making it dispensable. Once the minutes are reduced, it is not going to come back. It begins with 10 minutes taken away and the danger is that it will be gone forever. Please support the arts in our schools. Say something and take a stand.

• There has to be other ways to cut costs and not arts teachers. The losers will be the students who will have less time for the arts in their education. It has been documented that countries that teach the arts everyday score higher on math, science and language arts nationally.

FAME Philharmonic Composition Project

This year several FABulous Fourth Grade student composers are participating in a once in a lifetime experience in music composition along with FAME Composer-In-Residence, David Crowe, renowned composer and friend of FAME, to create an original orchestral composition. The piece will be performed by the Fort Wayne Philharmonic and the Fort Wayne Ballet Youth Company at the Fort Wayne Philharmonic Celebration of Youth Concert on Sunday, **March 22, 2009, at 3:00 P.M.**, at the Grand Wayne Center, in Fort Wayne.

Mr. Crowe is currently in the process of scoring the final draft of the composition for symphonic orchestra and has entitled it, "**TOTEMS: spirits of water, earth and sky**". The piece, inspired by the Native-

American culture and its close relationship to nature, includes musical depictions portraying the animal spirits of the water, the earth, and the sky. On **Saturday, March 21, 2009**, at 10:00 A.M., at the Philharmonic Center, at the Rhinehart Music Center at IPFW, the student composers and their parents will attend the composition's official rehearsal, where Mr. Crowe will conduct a final "composium" session (at 9:00 A.M.) to analyze their musical ideas in the finished composition. The project will culminate with an 1:45 P.M. mini-rehearsal and the premiere performance by the Fort Wayne Philharmonic and the Fort Wayne Ballet Youth Company, at the *Fort Wayne Philharmonic Celebration of Youth Concert*, at 3:00 P.M., Sunday, March 22, 2009, the Grand Wayne Center, Fort Wayne.

Wabash FAME Festival—Honeywell Center

The festival planning committee has come up with some creative, new ideas to help market our festival. Last year, we hosted approximately 1,000 participants and this year, we look forward to 1,500 participants. Poster designs are coming in at a steady pace. This year, we will have 10 to 11 groups participating with some very creative pictures. Besides poster winners, we will have note cards printed to fundraise for extra FAME activities. For another fundraiser, we are collecting used cell phones, inkjet cartridges, laptop computers, digital cameras and digital video cameras to send into Ecophones. We get money for every item we send. It isn't big money, but helps out and supports project green as we help recycle electronic equipment.

- We anticipate fun with the painting of hand chairs from our Solid Waste Management office. This project was generated here in the Wabash committee. The chairs are good conversation pieces and are really comfortable. We have one in our school library for the last several years, courtesy of Wabash Solid Waste Management. The auction of these chairs can also help create some revenue.
- I am excited that we will have **OD TAP IMI** as our visiting music artists for school workshops in March and then again for our April festival. The students will have great creative fun making music with "found" objects along with the musicians. Also, a visual artist will guide students in making their art from found objects. Our specific clinician isn't finalized at this time. Wabash's festival will feature Alice's Fun with Bubbles program. Alice Stickler from Huntington will perform with soap bubbles in various shapes and sizes. Her bubbles can even climb a ladder! In some programs, she can totally encapsulate a person in a bubble. She will present two 45-minute programs at the festival.
- At the festival, we will include creative drama/music activities and dance workshops. Solid Waste Management will display products made from recycled materials and a display of used barn wood furniture created by local craftsmen, David and Kelli Brace. More artists using found objects are also sought for display.
- Festival day will feature a full lobby of student artwork from our participating schools. Student performances will be featured in the gymnasium and the Ford Theater. We hope you are planning to register your school and come participate in our festival. The performances are a great way to showcase your elementary or jr. high students in a non-threatening non-competitive atmosphere. You can bring any music, dance, drama, band activity that you are doing in your classroom. Have your students come perform and then enjoy spending time with our professional artists, making the projects in the Imaginarium area located in the skating rink and painting FAME t-shirts.


